

# Ph.D. Admission Announcement for the Session 2020-21

<u>Medical Faculties</u>: Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Pharmacology, Community Medicine, Forensic Medicine & Clinical Subjects. <u>Other Faculties</u>: Pharmacy, Physiotherapy & Dentistry.

## 1. ELIGIBILITY:

### FULL TIME /PART TIME CANDIDATES

Every candidate excepting Nursing candidates who presents himself/herself for registration for the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) must possess Post Graduate Degree with minimum 55% (50% for ST/SC/OBC/PWD) awarded by this University or of any other University or any other qualification recognized by this University as equivalent thereto; as prescribed by university time to time.

#### MINIMUM ESSENTIAL QUALIFICATION



**Note:** Candidates appearing in the final year examination of master (PG) degree are also eligible to apply and appear in the Entrance examination. However, their enrolment in Ph.D. Course will be subject to the completion of all the requisite requirements. The results of Pre Ph.D. Entrance Examination of such candidate will be announced only after verification of marks at the PG level examinations.

## 2. DURATION OF RESEARCH WORK

- Ph.D. programme shall be for a minimum duration of three years and a maximum of six years.
- Extension beyond the above limits will be governed by the relevant clauses as stipulated in the Statues/Ordinance of the University.
- A candidate, who is a full time teacher or the person in service, shall be permitted to complete the research work at his college or place of his duty or appointment. In such condition, it shall be mandatory for such teacher candidate or person in Government / Private Service to work at least 180 days in the full tenure of the Ph. D. course, by way of leave / Vacation / deputation, etc. under direct supervision of his guide or research Supervisor before submission of the final thesis
- The women candidates and Persons with Disability (more than 40% disability) may be allowed a relaxation of two years for Ph.D. in the maximum duration. In addition the women candidate may be provided Maternity Leave/Child Care Leave once in the entire duration of Ph.D. for upto to 240 days.

#### 3. PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION TO Ph.D. PROVISIONAL REGISTRATION

- There shall be a two-phased admission process for the Ph.D. programme of the Geetanjali University. Phase – I: Entrance examination and Phase – II: Research Proposal Presentation & Personal Interview.
- Only those candidates who secure minimum 50% marks in admission process would be eligible for applying for admission.
- Notwithstanding the above, candidates who have passed the CSIR-UGC ICMR JRF / NET examination (or) examination by agencies like DBT/DST etc. (or) GATE (or) shall be exempted from appearing for the Ph.D. Entrance Examination.
- A candidate applying for Ph.D. admission shall submit an application to the Dean PG Studies, Geetanjali University, Udaipur in the prescribed form obtainable from the University Office or on website alongwith the required documents and fee, within the stipulated time furnishing the following information:-

Qualifications and details of previous study/teaching/clinical experience and research if any, and full particulars of publications (with reprints) to his/her credit in accredited journals; Broad field of research in which he/she intends to pursue research;

After successfully clearing the Phase – I: Ph.D. Entrance Examination, candidates are invited for Phase – II: Research Proposal Presentation and Personal Interview, which



includes introduction; review of literature and research gap; aims and objective of the study; plan of work; materials and methods; hypothesis and anticipated outcome references; questionnaire if any

- In respect of an inter-disciplinary research the main branch of postgraduate degree in which the candidate has qualified and the other field of research intended;, the guide will be that of the main branch of postgraduate degree in which the candidate has qualified.
- Applications of the candidates will be placed before the University Research Committee . The Committee will examine the credentials of the candidate and review the usefulness of the research proposal after due presentation followed by personal interview. Candidates who have satisfactorily defended their proposed research alone will be recommended by the Research Committee for provisional registration. If the Research Committee does not *prima facie* find the applicant qualified and/or the research proposal suitable, it may recommend rejection of the application for provisional registration straightaway. The Committee may also direct the candidate to submit a revised proposal incorporating the recommendations made by it.
- > Only a pre-determined number of students shall be admitted to the Ph. D. programme.

<u>Note:</u> Admission in Ph.D. degree program is based on Merit, availability of Ph.D. Guide in respective subject and research support. Passing of Entrance Examination does not necessarily guarantee of enrolment in Ph.D. program.
